

## BASIC MARIMBA



### HOW TO INSTALL

To install, unzip and drag the instrument folder to any hard drive. Launch Kontakt 4.22 or higher and load the .nki instruments. Please do not move any file! By installing the product you accept the enclosed product license agreement.

### DESCRIPTION

A marimba is a percussion instrument which consists of a set of wooden bars with resonators. The arrangement of the bars corresponds to those of a piano with the accidentals raised vertically and overlapping the natural bars. The bars are struck with mallets to produce its tone.

Our marimba has a range of 5 octaves.

# CINEMATIQUE INSTRUMENTS

## CONTENT

As the name „Basic Marimba“ suggests, we are coming up with a rough and basic version of a marimba. This is because we recorded the marimba on the fly in between an orchestral break. By saying that, it becomes obvious that we only intended to take a snapshot of the marimba: we quickly miked it up and recorded some main playing techniques with up to 3 Round Robin variations and 3 velocity layer. In order to get a proper and useful instrument we spend some time with post production and editing the whole instrument.


Even though we are aware of the fact that our marimba is not a very complex and extravagant instrument, we still decided to release the "Basic Marimba" as the final piece in our series of "Clearing Out the Stock". The Basic Marimba is well suited for quite a lot music productions.

3 Patches are available:

**Basic Marimba.** This is the regular Marimba sound struck with mallets, 3 Round Robin with up to 3 velocity layer, knobs to control the amount of reverb and delay, switches to turn on/ off a speaker- and a rotary simulation, a switch for doubling the sound and a button to switch between close and far ambience.

**Basic Marimba Muted.** The same instrument recorded as muted variation (similar options as mentioned in the „Rude Marimba“)

**Towel Marimba.** As the name suggest we recorded these sounds by laying a towel over the bars (similar options as mentioned in the „Basic Marimba“)
